RULES OF TROOP 113

All Scouts have the right to be safe, secure & respected

Follow the Scout Oath

On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law; to help other people at all times; to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.

Follow the Scout Law

A Scout is Trustworthy, Loyal, Helpful, Friendly, Courteous, Kind, Obedient, Cheerful, Thrifty, Brave, Clean, and Reverent.

No alcohol, tobacco products or drugs (Major)

No verbal or physical abuse (Major)

No Physical Altercation

No weapons . . . sheath knife or folding knife with 5" maximum length blade allowed with totin chit. (Major)

exceptions:

Fish filet knife if cased in tackle box when fishing

Souvenirs being brought home from a trip which are kept in original packaging

No fireworks (Major)

Do not play with matches (Major if in a tent)

Do not steal (Major)

No foul language, books or magazines

Please do not escape your duties

Give proper respect to leaders

Respect others' property, do not misuse troop equipment, keep your tent and gear clean and in order No pressurized cans or bottles of any type -- includes lighters, bug spray

exception: propane brought by Patrol or Troop

Campfires only in locations approved first by Scoutmaster or SPL

Lights out at 10:30 P.M., be quiet by 11:00 P.M. (subject to change by Scoutmaster or SPL)

CONSEQUENCES OF VIOLATIONS OF TROOP RULES:

IF AT ANY ONE TROOP MEETING, CAMPING TRIP, OR OTHER TROOP ACTIVITY YOU VIOLATE THESE RULES, HERE IS WHAT WILL HAPPEN:

- #1 1st time -- The Scoutmaster or adult leader in charge and the SPL will meet with you, tell you what you did wrong, and give you a warning by saying, "This is your first warning."
- #2 2nd time -- The Scoutmaster or adult leader in charge and the SPL will meet with you, tell you what you did wrong, and give you a warning by saying, "This is your second warning". After this second warning, you will be cut from the group and asked to spend ten minutes "cooling off".

#3 - 3rd time -- The Scoutmaster or adult leader in charge and the SPL will meet with you, tell you what you did wrong, and tell you, "This is your third and final warning." After this third warning, you will be cut from the group and asked to leave the meeting or camp. If you cannot leave the meeting because you are waiting for a ride, you will be kept away from the group until your ride arrives. If we are at camp, your parents will be called and asked to come and remove you from camp. In either case, your parents will be notified of your violations of Troop Rules. You will be welcome to come back to the next Troop meeting.

Continued problems with violations of the rules of the Troop can and will result in hearings before the Troop Committee and may result in suspension from all Troop activities for extended periods.

NOTE: Violation of rules marked (Major) will result in #3 immediately.
